## A TELEGRAM TO POZSONY FROM 1851

There was a telegraphic service in Hungary from 1847. It developed in parallel with the railways and was treated as a postal service. Apart from some railway companies, private operators were excluded.

The charge for sending a telegram depended on how far it was travelling. From October 1850 to September 1863 there were 10 inland distance zones. A message of up to 20 words cost 60 Kreuzer for each distance zone between the despatching and receiving telegraph offices.

## 7 February 1851

## Telegram form and envelope

This telegram was despatched in Vienna at 7.50am and received in Pozsony at 8.00am. The message was transcribed on a telegram form *(above)*. It was then sealed in a telegram envelope *(left)* with the stamp 'K.K.TELEGRAPHEN BUREAU PRESSBURG' *(right)*. Both documents were marked with the message number 333 / 700.

The recipient was required to sign for delivery of the envelope.
