1916, June 17. Hungarian telegram arrival form dated 1915 XI at right. Non-secure telegram received from the Donauflotillenkommando in Rousze (Russe/Roustchouk in Bulgaria) addressed to the Marinedetachement, Budapest, HQ of the Austro-Hungarian Danube flotilla. Postmarked with a Budapest 3 C datestamp, folded and sealed with a pink sealing label (remains on the reverse). On arrival the cachet of the K.u.K Marinedetachement in Budapest was applied, and it was entered into a registry and given a number. The text in German appears to concern a 'delegation' of five sailors who will be enlisted (possibly brought back from the reserve) at the end of June. Transcription errors have had to be interpreted in purple pencil. A snapshot of personnel movement.

Of those mentioned in the telegram text, according to the 1917 edition of the Marine-Almanach:

Linienschiffsleutnant Otto Metzger was born in 1872 and was by then in retirement, having served in this rank since 1905.

Seefähnrich (midshipman) Emmerich Horváth was born in 1885, joined the Navy on 18 May 1915, was promoted to this rank on 1 November 1916, and was in the marine reserve.

Seefähnrich Julius Thurzo was born in 1882, joined the Navy on 7 April 1904, was promoted to this level (presumably from Seekadett) on 1 November 1916, and was in the Seewehr, but not on active service.

Korvettenleutnant Theodor Isepy was born in 1892, joined the Navy on 10 October 1912, was promoted to this rank on 1 November 1916, and was in the marine reserve.

Seefähnrich Michael Gramantik was born in 1882, joined the Navy on 1 October 1904, was promoted to this rank on 1 July 1916, and was in the Seewehr, but not on active service.
